

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Some journals I find on the internet ask for my Athens username and password. I log in with Athens but still don't get the full text of articles. Why is that?**

Your NHS OpenAthens username and password will give you only the whole text of those journals for which the NHS pays (whether NHS England, the region or your local NHS library and knowledge service). The best thing to do is to check the *Journals A-Z Search* to see whether we pay for a title before spending time trying to log into titles we don't buy.

**Are there any collections of open access titles that I can use?**

Yes, here are some of the larger collections. If you have time to spare you could Google the article you need and see if it is available for free. Publishers often make 'taster' articles free to everyone.

**What if the library and knowledge service does not have the journal electronically?**

If you have checked the *Journals A-Z Search* and we don't hold the journal electronically, check on the list to see whether it is available in print. If it is in your local NHS library in print, you can photocopy the article yourself. If it is not listed at all, let us know by email or using our article request form online [www.bsuh.nhs.uk/library/article/](http://www.bsuh.nhs.uk/library/article/) and we will get hold of a copy of the article for you. Please allow around 5 days for receipt of articles from other libraries.

# Finding articles in electronic journals

**Is the journal available electronically?**

To locate an article from an electronic journal, you first need to find out whether the journal is available electronically. All of our electronic journals are listed in one place, via *Journals A-Z Search*. You will need an NHS OpenAthens account to access the complete list. Register for an NHS OpenAthens account at <https://openathens.nice.org.uk/>

On the library and knowledge service homepage, [www.bsuh.nhs.uk/library](http://www.bsuh.nhs.uk/library), click on **Journals** to search the list.

When prompted, log in with your NHS OpenAthens username and password.

Print copies say 'Available from...' with a [location] note indicating which library the print journal is held in. You will see all copies held by the libraries within the Trust for which you work.

**Which title do I access?**

Sometimes one journal title can be accessed through a number of different electronic versions. The different links give details about where to access the title and what years are available electronically. Identify carefully the volumes and years we hold for each copy to see if one of the copies covers the volume and year you need. Electronic copies sometimes come with embargoes, which means you cannot get the most recent articles—but the copy information will provide further information.

What you see next will depend on which company supplies the journal. You may still be logged in with OpenAthens, but check for a login box if not. If you have been instructed to use your OpenAthens username and password, look for the Athens login link — it will not always be obvious!
