IF YOU NEED IMMEDIATE RAPID RESPONSE CALL 2222  
TO PUT OUT A MEDICAL EMERGENCY CALL

- BEFORE YOU CALL • Have you done your ABCDE assessment
- Have you got the relevant observation chart / fluid chart / patient nursing notes / health records in front of you?
  - Consider the response time that you are expecting
  - Inform the nurse in charge or night practitioner (state who);
