When should I use the World Health setting?




For members: use when a member has an interest in tropical / travel medicine, low-income countries, or non-UK healthcare.

For resources: use INSTEAD of any other setting when a resource is primarily about low-income countries or tropical medicine. For example, in the article:

[Critical care nursing in Zambia: global healthcare integration](#)

the setting Intensive Care should not be selected. This avoids sending the resource to people with an interest in critical care nursing but no interest in the Zambian context.

## Did you know?

You can create topic-specific page URLs in KnowledgeShare to use in promotion and training. Just add a category name at the end of the main KnowledgeShare URL, like this:

[www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/diabetes](http://www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/diabetes)

This generates a publicly accessible page listing matching resources, with the most recent first.

You can combine more than one category using commas:

[www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/stroke.physiotherapist](http://www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/stroke.physiotherapist)

For spaces within category names use underscore:

[www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/bipolar\\_disorder](http://www.knowledgeshare.nhs.uk/bipolar_disorder)

You can then share these links in emails, promotional materials, resource lists, etc.
